



The problem

The Victorian roof at St Alphege Church, built in 1845, had become a growing concern amongst the local community - so much so that many worried the old church may not survive for future generations.

The solution

A 'Raise the Roof' appeal was launched to help raise money to fix the rapidly ageing structure. When it reached the target of £200,000, the vital repair work to protect the church's historic ceiling could begin.

Kent-based Clague Architects specified Cembrit Glendyne natural slates, as they had worked with

SIMPLE OVER-ROOFING SAVES THE DAY

The problem

Belfast Self Storage's 3000m² asbestos cement roof, comprising three different sheet profiles, was deteriorating and required frequent repairs to tackle water ingress. Moving the storage units to avoid the incoming water was also causing major disruption.

Added to that, the potential price tag of removing all the fibre cement profiles was also looking ominously high due to asbestos disposal costs.

The solution

Filon's lightweight GRP Over-roofing system allowed the existing roof to be overlaid without strengthening the supporting structure. In fact, the completed roof has a lower total weight than before, as the weight of the new Filon sheets is less than the weight of rainwater the asbestos sheets were absorbing.

What we learned

Ray McNulty of Professional Roofing Services said: "The client required that the roof work was completed as quickly as possible and thanks to the simplicity and ease-of-handling of the system, we were able to complete this large project within a couple of weeks.


Life on the Edge

When you use a good quality dry verge system you not only expect it to provide a neat finish to the roof edge, you also expect it to give essential weatherproofing.

Areas such as preventing wind uplift of the tiles or slates are a key part of preventing damage to the roof. Danelaw's Dry Verges give you exactly that kind of peace of mind. Their range comprises large format, interlocking plain and thin leading edge, all of which comply with BS 8612, and a range of slate verges. They give you a neat, modern appearance to suit all commonly available profiles of roofs.

You can also install the large format dry verge systems on refurbishment projects where the ends of the tile battens have decayed. You can usually secure fixing by adding a continuous batten secured to the top of the gable wall of the property.




Happy Valleys

Valley Board Construction Guidelines from Hambleside Danelaw.

Check your knowledge of Valley Trough applications with these key points to look out for...

- All inclined roof valleys using valley troughs or other valley lining materials should be supported by valley or sarking boards.
- Valley boards may be inset or continuous over the rafters. The boards should provide a minimum of 50mm support for the ends of the slate or tile battens. When inset, they should be a minimum of 12mm plywood or 19mm softwood supported on bearers of approximately 50mm x 25mm fixed to the rafter sides, set at a depth to finish the valley board flush with the top of the rafters.
- You can also use continuous overlaid valley boards with a minimum of 6mm plywood jointed over supporting rafters. On rafter spacings above 400mm, fix adequate support noggins under the outer edge of the valley boards.
- Trim the fascia or barge board at the eaves to allow the valley trough to pass over without flattening the profile. Alternatively, use a lead or lead replacement soaker.



FLAT ROOFS AREN'T FLAT

New British Standard clarifies zero falls.



The 2018 revised version of the British Standard on flat roofing, issued in November last year, now has the snappy title 'BS EN 6229:2018 - Flat Roofs with continuously supported flexible waterproof coverings'.

Highly memorable labels aside, the 2018 Code deals with the overall principles of design, construction, care and maintenance of flat roofs. It specifically addresses many misunderstandings over non-compliance and bad practice in the design of roof falls.

The bottom line is that a flat roof is 'still less than ten degrees' but 'should have a minimum finished fall of 1:80' (unless suitably supported by independent third-party certification) and should 'never be less than zero'.

In short, flat roofs aren't flat; they should drain positively, and certainly never have back falls.
