ENQUIRY 4

Time to get familiar with the changes in consumer law

The Consumer Rights Act 2015 came into force in October and aims to give customers more rights when dealing with poor service or goods and as contractors, we need to be aware of how this will affect us.

In practice, the changes to the legislation mean the rights your customers have in relation to the goods and services you supply remain largely the same. However what has changed are the rules relating to the supply of goods, services and digital content for contracts made from the date the law came into force. A single set of rules now applies to all contracts where goods are supplied – including work and materials contracts, sale, hire and hire-purchase.

Changes to the law mean it is now easier for your customers to understand their rights and to challenge bad practice with remedies if things go wrong. This could include things such as putting the work right, replacing poor quality goods or reducing the cost of the project.

The Consumer Rights Act 2015 also now states clear time periods during which customers can seek a repair, replacement or refund – all things you may be legally obliged to provide. There are also a number of other changes that could affect contractors, including:

- For the first time customers have a specific timeframe to reject a faulty item and get a full refund - now 30 days

- Customers can ask for a refund or price reduction after one failed attempt by the contractor to repair or replace a faulty item
- If customers don't want a refund or price reduction, they can ask for another repair or replacement at no cost to them
- No deduction can be made from a refund in the first six months after purchase
- A 'tiered' remedy system for faulty goods, digital content and services means customers' rights to a refund are clearer. Whether they're entitled to a refund depends on how long they've owned the product



It's also now easier for customers to challenge hidden fees and charges, as the key terms of a contract, including price, may be assessed for fairness unless they're prominent and transparent.

The most significant change for contractors is the increased clarity around the right to reject goods – and when that right is lost. The new presumption is that customers should not have to accept multiple attempts during the repair or replacement period. So, if you have a customer who has lost the right to reject - but who then asks for a repair or replacement, you only have one chance to get it right before their right to reject is reinstated.

For a lot of us, these changes won't really make any difference to the way we work as many contractors always complete jobs to the very highest of standards and will put right anything that goes wrong as standard practice. However the new law states that contractors must follow certain standards:

- They must provide their service with reasonable care and skill

- Be aware that the information said to the consumer is binding where the consumer relies on it
- Ensure that they carry out the service within a reasonable time and price - particularly if it is not agreed before entering into a contract

ALTERNATIVE DISPUTE RESOLUTION (ADR)

Another consumer rights measure that came into force recently is the 2015 European Directive on Alternative Dispute Resolution. The Directive helps customers sort out problems with goods or services they have paid for, without having to resort to legal action.

This means that contractors now need to have a clear and transparent dispute resolution process in place before they enter into a contract with a customer, regardless of the monetary values of the work or service.

To ensure your business is properly set up to protect both you and your customers,

it's worth speaking to an organisation such as TrustMark. TrustMark has its own service to help members comply with the new ADR law, which could save you considerable time and money if you find yourself in a dispute.

Ultimately, these changes to the law are designed to help us and our customers operate in a fairer way. By embracing the new rules and making sure we treat our customers fairly, consumer confidence in our industry will grow stronger. And, that's good for everyone.

One unusual project. ONE simple warranty

Heritage Roofing & Renovation Ltd is pleased to be the first contractor to complete a full roof refurbishment under ONE Warranty.



AN EXTREMELY CHALLENGING PROJECT...

It didn't take long for Heritage Roofing & Renovation Ltd to realise that the job they'd taken on would be no ordinary re-roof. The building was an early 20th Century detached town house in Dorking, Surrey, with a 170m² roof that comprised four Barn Hips and two Gable Ends –

highly unusual, and extremely challenging, for a building of this size.

The varying pitches meant the roof had almost no straight runs, so every single component had to be cut to the correct size, depending on the area of the roof.

The SR Timber roofing battens were therefore all individually cut and laid, as was the TIL-R underlay and SIGNature Clay Tiles. If this wasn't time and labour intensive enough, the six fibreglass dry valleys – another unusual characteristic for a roof this size – made it all the more tricky.

... REQUIRING A COMPLETE RE-ROOF

The new roof covering – comprised of approximately 9,000 SIGNature Clay Tiles, Hips and Ridges, together with TIL-R dry fix ridge kits. When installing the kits, a valley tray was required to support the weight of the materials - two new dormer and two new Velux windows were also installed.

The dormer windows were fitted on a separate flat section of the roof that also required refurbishment. It proved to be yet another tricky part of the job as two valleys, either side of the flat roof, needed additional lead work and re-rendering.

Once the roof area was refurbished, Heritage straightened the crowns of the building's chimney stacks to ensure a neat professional finish, before installing lead flashing around them and re-rendering where necessary.

Further inspection revealed rotting timbers on various parts of the eaves, fascias and soffits that needed replacing, as well as render that needed to be cleaned and repainted to ensure a professional and attractive finish. It was during this clean up that the team also discovered a purlin that was close to penetrating the frame. To avoid any future maintenance issues for the homeowner, this was also removed and replaced.



The amount of varying pitches and valleys on the pitched section, as well as the positioning of the flat roof section and its surroundings, meant this was one of the most challenging projects the company had been involved with. 

Getting it right first time

As part of their commitment to helping raise standards and comply to BS 5534:2014, DuPont tell us why, when it comes to breather membranes, you need to think about more than just wind zones.

One of the key changes introduced by the revised BS 5534 Standards concerns underlays; now in order to be compliant in all five wind zones at a 345mm batten gauge, a membrane must meet the following test criteria:

- 1,600 N/M² when a well-sealed ceiling is present
- 1,900 N/M² when no ceiling or no well-sealed ceiling is present
- 2,350 N/M² when no ceiling or no well-sealed ceiling is present and a permanent dominant opening is present on an external face of the building

Thanks in part to clearer product labelling and manufacturers' guides, it's fairly easy to choose the correct underlay based on this criteria. However, it isn't just the wind zone you need to think about. To fully comply with the new Standard, you also need to consider whether the job you're working on exceeds any of the following:

- Ridge height not greater than 15m
- Roof pitch between 12.5° and 75°
- Site altitude not greater than 100m
- No significant site topography

If the site exceeds any of these, contractors will need to perform a wind loading calculation to assess the product's wind uplift performance. However, who carries out this calculation? How much does it cost? When you simply want to get on with the job, a time consuming extra like this is something you can do without.





The green green grass of... roofs!

The demand for green roofs is growing.

In recent years, green roofing has blossomed into a mainstream flat roofing system. Everyone from architects and contractors, to home owners and especially local planning authorities have recognised its benefits. As a result, green roofs are sprouting up just about anywhere. If you're keen to know more about Green Roofs read on...

ENVIRONMENTAL ADVANTAGES

It is now widely recognised that extensive planting within urban areas is a great means of improving air quality. Naturally, that means green roofs can contribute to the reduction of a number of polluting air particles - with plants reducing carbon dioxide in the atmosphere and producing oxygen. They also improve water quality by helping to prevent polluting particles entering the water system through surface run off from the roof.



BIODIVERSITY AND WILDLIFE

Green roofs are intrinsically of greater benefit to biodiversity than more traditional roofing methods, and they provide many benefits for wildlife compared to non-green roofs. The biodiversity of green roofs can be enhanced even further by the placing of objects such as dead wood and old branches, and being designed to meet specific local biodiversity needs.

ENERGY REDUCTION

The thermal performance and roof insulation for buildings is recognised as a huge benefit of green roof systems. A green roof not only acts as an insulation barrier, the combination of plant and soil processes reduces the amount of solar energy impacting the building. In winter root activity of plants, air layers and the effect of the entire green roof system create heat and thereby provide a natural insulation membrane.

URBAN HEAT ISLAND EFFECT

The urban heat island effect is the difference in temperature between urban areas and the surrounding countryside - in part this is due to large areas of hard reflective surfaces and can be as much as a 5°C difference. Green roofs help to absorb heat reducing urban temperatures, and subsequent improvements in air pollution.

NOISE AND SOUND INSULATION

Sound waves are absorbed, reflected or deflected by the combination of soil, plants and trapped layers of air within green roof systems - creating a sound insulation barrier and reducing sound compared with a conventional roof system. The

growing medium tends to block lower sound frequencies, whilst the plants block higher frequencies. The amount of sound insulation is dependent on the system used and the substrate depth.

RECYCLED MATERIALS

Recycled materials are used in the membranes and growing mediums, making green roofs even greener! By using crushed porous brick or on-site aggregate (which is regularly taken from the original site), green roofs decrease the need for waste disposal to landfill and transportation to disposal of waste.

RAINWATER

Green roofs are a fantastic store of rainwater with slower evaporation of water into the atmosphere. As much as 70-80% of rainfall is retained in the summer with between 25-40% in winter. Green roofs also reduce and delay run off during times of heavy and prolonged rainfall. Green roofs, therefore, reduce the impact of run off of heavy rainfall reducing the likelihood of local flooding.

GREEN SPACE AND HEALTH

The value of green spaces to people living and working in towns and cities has been increasingly recognised in recent years. Green roofs not only help perform an ecological function, visually soften the built-up environment and support biodiversity - they also provide access to birdsong and seasonal colour changes. These are proved to aid people's mental and physical health, and are attributed to helping to reduce a person's heart rate and blood-pressure.

With so many flat roofing options available, how do you match the right product to the right job and budget?

Roofing has come a long way since using the woolly skin of a giant mammoth to keep the rain out. These days, we're spoilt for choice with the sheer number of solid and secure options available.

Flat roofing, in particular, came into its stride in the early 19th century, with the invention of liquid waterproofing. Originally a combination of natural bitumen and man-made materials – such as jute, straw and rag felt – by the mid-20th century the modern materials we see today were becoming popular. These have been continually developed and enhanced in the intervening years to create the vast array of high quality flat roofing materials we now use.
