## Russell builds on success

# St Paul's Stone Gallery restored

Asphalte Ltd recently replaced original asphalt laid in 1906 to the Stone Gallery in St Paul's Cathedral as part of a sensitive conservation project.

At 53 metres high, the Stone Gallery's exposure to the elements and surface deterioration had caused water ingress inside the Dome. Sussex Asphalte's skilled craftsmen used IKO Permaphalt, a specially formulated, polymermodified mastic asphalt, to replace the original materials. Works were phased for continued public access and the asphalt was stripped and re-laid in sections to ensure watertightness - as the

To apply the correct width of asphalt, a gutter template was fabricated and used as a guide, requiring skilled, precision work. Other detail work involved adjustments to rainwater outlets to improve drainage and a double-angle fillet around the Galley's circumference -286 linear metres!

The works were completed ahead of schedule, and IKO and Sussex Asphalte won a UK Roofing Award for Best Mastic Asphalt Project in May.



# Redland Regent crowns residential block

The residents of a block of 30 apartments have been saved from years of leaking roofs thanks to Redland's products. Kearton Place in Surrey was built in the mid 1990s and has been managed on behalf of the freeholders by Richard Mason for the past 18 years.

One of the landmarks of the Brighton seafront, the upmarket Abbotts Building, is once again watertight and guaranteed to remain so for 25 years now that a new roof has been specified,



manufactured and supplied by loopal and installed by an Icopal approved contractor.

Thermal imaging showed that water had penetrated through the top layer of asphalt and then travelled along the roof until it penetrated through the next layer and through to the concrete deck beneath. Previous repairs had been ineffective as it was impossible to find exactly

where the leaks had started from where they emerged.

IMA member, Clarke Roofing (Southern), was awarded the contract and installed Icopal QD Bitumen Primer on top of the existing mastic asphalt, before then installing the vapour control layer, Profiles Vapour Vent XL, and the adhesive layer, Bonding To Bitumen Stripes. The insulation was Thermazone Torch-On

Insulation, with Profiles Vent XL U/L underlay and a capsheet of Profiles XL PLUS FireSmart<sup>®</sup> Mineral.

Clarke Roofing was on site for six weeks, assisted by Icopal throughout via regular contact and on-site inspections.



# Don't get caught out by the flue

The NFRC have recently had a number of enquiries from members about how to deal with vertical gas flues that vent through roofs - a common feature of houses built in the 1980s. The answer is simple: call a Gas Safe Registered engineer, as domestic gas boilers produce carbon monoxide, a poisonous gas that you can't see, smell or taste and which can be fatal.

If a flue is damaged, blocked, restricted, badly fitted or poorly serviced, the risk of carbon monoxide exposure is high. As a roofing contractor, you need to make sure you take the proper precautions and advice if you come across a flue, as they can not only endanger life, they may also lead to a hefty fine. In 2015, for example, a contractor



re-roofing a flat roof above a flat in Paignton, Devon was fined £2,000 plus legal costs for failing to reconnect a flue to the boiler. The fault was only detected after the resident contacted a Gas Safe engineer to inspect what they thought was a faulty boiler; the engineer duly got in touch with HSE.

So, always seek advice from a Gas Safe Registered engineer before starting work and remember that only a Gas Safe Registered engineer can ever work on a gas flue. The engineer will assess the work being carried out, and in most cases, will disconnect the appliance from the gas supply until the work is completed.

On completion, the engineer will reconnect the appliance and carry out several specific tests as required in the Gas Safety (Installation & Use Regulations), before classifying the appliance as safe to use.




## BS 5534 update -Roofing Underlays



In February 2018, the second amendment of the British Standards for Slating and Tiling, BS 5534:2014 + A2:2018 was introduced. For the first time, this includes a clear definition of air permeable underlays. The Standard now defines a low water vapour resistance (type LR) and air permeable underlay as having: "...a water vapour resistance not more than 0.25 MNs/g combined with an air permeability of not less than 20 m<sup>3</sup>/m<sup>2</sup>.h at 50Pa.'

The 'nominal' 10mm underlay sag has also been redefined as a 15mm maximum drape, to avoid excessive ballooning damaging the tile fixings through wind uplift forces. It's still important to ensure the drape is adequate to allow free drainage of water



This Standard also references BS 8216, covering dry fixed ridge, hip and verge systems. Roofshield avoids the need to use these systems as it covers and protects the entire ridge, removing any risk of water penetration and delays to internal works.

## Blind Driving Challenge


