an accreditation Standard supported and recognised by both consumers and the construction supply chain. The initial four-year programme is a matched-funding partnership between CITB and NFRC, with NFRC managing its development and delivery.

The goal is to accredit 5,000 roofing operatives initially, then for the scheme to be self-sustaining.

Glendyne restores historic chapel to former glory

Cembrit Glendyne natural slates have been specified and installed on a unique renovation project for the Historic Hampshire landmark, Netley Chapel. Before slating began, the local community were invited to site to mark the occasion and 'sponsor a slate', helping to finance the restoration. For a small donation, visitors wrote a message and signed the reverse of a roof slate. More than 900 Glendyne slates were decorated, raising £6,600 for the Friends of the Royal Victoria Country Park. These slates were then installed on the roof of the chapel by Elliotts Premier Roofing of Southampton.



Royal Victoria Country Park was once the site of the world's largest military hospital, the Royal Victoria Hospital (or Netley Hospital). Now, all that remains of the original structure, which fell into decline after being severely damaged by fire in 1963, is

Netley Chapel. Thanks to a multi-million pound grant from Hampshire County Council and the Heritage Lottery Fund, the Victorian-era building has recently undergone extensive renovation, and now marks the beginning of a new chapter for the chapel.

Heritage market building gets the AH-25 treatment to restore civic pride

Plymouth Market, an important local shopping facility, is housed in a tall Grade II listed concrete building with a distinctive curved shell formation for its main roof.

The building replaced the previous market structure destroyed in World War II bombing and is included on the Statutory List of Buildings of Special Architectural and Historical Interest.

Over the years, the roof membrane had deteriorated causing multiple leaks.



Repairs were challenging because of the need to maintain 'business as usual' for market traders.

Working with SIG Design Technology, roofing contractors Clegg & Shortman used liquid waterproofing system Hydrostop AH-25. This is a one component product which is very low in odour, fast-curing

and fully reinforced with polyester fabric. It can be applied under practically any conditions – even as low as the 0°C temperatures experienced during the winter of the refurbishment.

Church's crowning glory sees Redland reach the heights



Shettleston New Parish Church in Glasgow's East End won the Roof Tiling category in the National Federation of Roofing Contractors' UK Roofing Awards 2018 following a recent re-roof.

Opened in 1904, the Grade B listed church is a handsome Arts and Crafts style building with Art Nouveau detailing. Unusually for Scotland, the roof was finished in clay tiles rather than slate - it had also reached the end of its life, leading to water ingress and rot.

BMI Redland's Rosemary Clay Craftsman tile was selected for its ease of use, finish and superior aesthetics. Two turrets, 14m and 3m tall, were the major challenges in the project.

When DM Roofing & Roughcasting inspected the roof, they found that the original pre-formed arris hip tiles were 'specials' and unavailable from stock at the angle required for the turrets. The tight re-roofing schedule meant there wasn't time for these to be made, so DM Roofing replaced them with a combination of Code 4 lead soakers and tiles that were individually mitred by hand.

Managing your cash flow



Cash flow is the lifeblood of any construction project, and it's crucial to manage it effectively. This is especially important for small businesses, where late payment and chasing debts is a major factor in at least 20% of insolvencies.

So, how can you maintain a positive cash flow and stay on the front foot?

Do some background homework

A bit of background research on a client before entering a contract could help you avoid problems later.

If your client has a history of failing to pay on time, querying invoices, or generally not co-operating, then consider walking away.

Asking other contractors for references is also highly recommended.

Cost forecasting

A cash flow forecast allows you to estimate how much cash you'll have at every stage of the project. From this you'll know when you need to be paid to cover materials and labour, whether things are on track and where you can cut costs if necessary.

Correct payment at the right time

This is fundamental to maintaining cash flow, so knowing how to correctly invoice clients is crucial. Agree payment terms before work starts and you will avoid confusion down the line.

If you're working on a larger project, then invoice regularly rather than at the end. You should also chase invoices as soon as they are overdue. This doesn't mean getting aggressive, but it does serve as a reminder for the client.

Also, make sure you accept electronic payments to speed the whole process up and help keep a one hundred per cent accurate record. Of course, you still need to stay on top of the books and keep an ongoing record of incomings and outgoings!

And, when plans change, as they inevitably will occasionally, the ability to communicate these changes to your client effectively will set you apart. Put them in writing for future reference

and check whether your client definitely has the necessary funds before making the change, however big or small.

Finally, a clear way for businesses to prevent a cash shortage is by always keeping some aside so a balance builds up over time. Having a policy of always drawing less than the profit made is a good way to do this.

Maintaining positive cash and running a profitable business is fundamentally down to the right preparation. Do the groundwork and you'll put your business in the very best position for success.

4 top tips to help you specify and install rainwater and eaves systems

Calculate the rainfall intensity

To ensure you choose the correct guttering system, first establish the roof area's predicted rainfall intensity. A useful guide to help you do this is BS EN 12056-3:2000 which provides detailed information on rainfall throughout the UK. Remember to factor in any additional capacity that might be needed.

Ensure joints are secure

Even with materials such as marine-grade aluminium rainwater systems, which are extremely robust and have a lifespan of 50 years or more, you need to make sure the connection between each component is totally secure. Check joint

surfaces are completely clean and dry and don't carry out joint sealing in wet weather, or in temperatures below 5°C or above 40°C.

Choose the right fixings

Ensuring the fixing components are capable of the necessary support is vital to long-term durability. Make sure the system manufacturer's recommended fixings are used at all times, and that they are non-corrosive and of a compatible material.

Refurbish fascias and soffits

Fascia and soffit systems are often replaced to accommodate new gutters. You can install composite aluminium products such as



Marley Alutec's Evoke range over rot-free timber fascias or directly onto the building. You can also easily adapt them on site and avoid costly delays.

Making pantile installation easier



If you want a traditional pantile roof then clay interlocking pantiles are a quick, easy and cost-effective option. Here, Marley Eternit answers some common installer questions:

1 - What's the lowest pitch for a clay roof

There are some clay interlocking tiles which allow you to achieve the traditional clay look at a much lower pitch. For

example, you can use Marley's Melodie clay interlocking pantiles, now available in Slate Grey, on pitches as low as 12.5°. These tiles are particularly good for extensions where the roof may be lower than the main property, but needs to blend with original pantiles.

2 - What happens if I need to go below the recommended minimum pitch?

Remember local building surveyors will almost always check that the roof tile or slate is suitable for your pitch. Laying a product

below its minimum pitch can prove to be a costly mistake, so always check your materials are suitable.

3 - How can I ensure correct ventilation?

Normal contour vents can usually only be used down to a pitch of 20°, so tile vents are not always suitable for low pitch installation - use a dry fix eaves vent system instead.
